HEALTH WORKFORCE OUTLOOK: PROJECTED GROWTH

- Nationally, employment in health occupations continues to grow much faster than average for all occupations, 15% compared to 6%
- Nursing related occupations are expected to grow between 6 and 34% from 2019-2029
- Growth is projected to be faster or much faster than average for all occupations for the same occupations in Virginia from 2018-2028.


